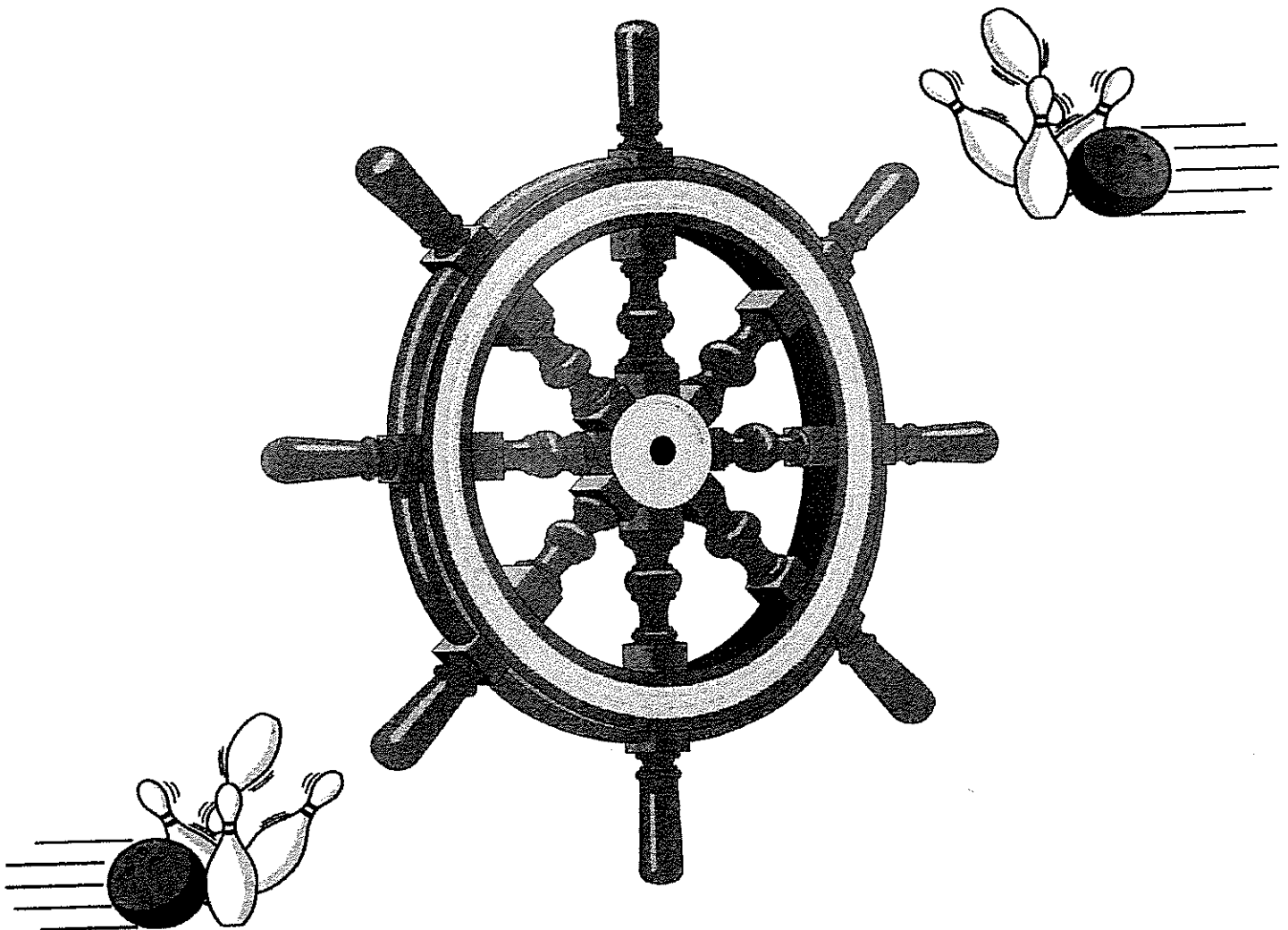

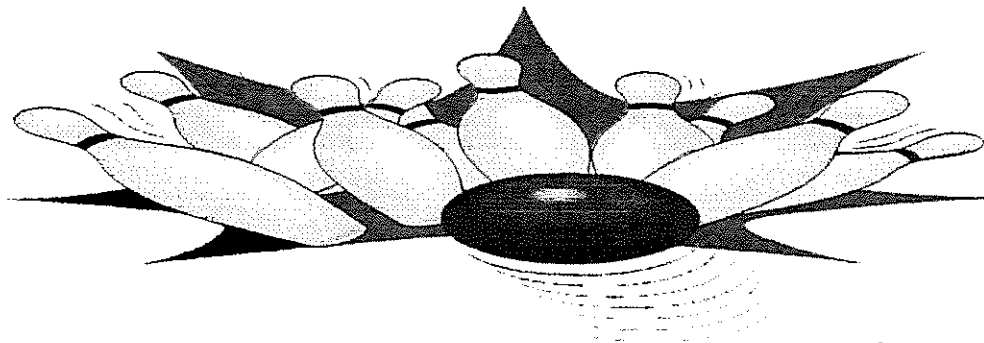

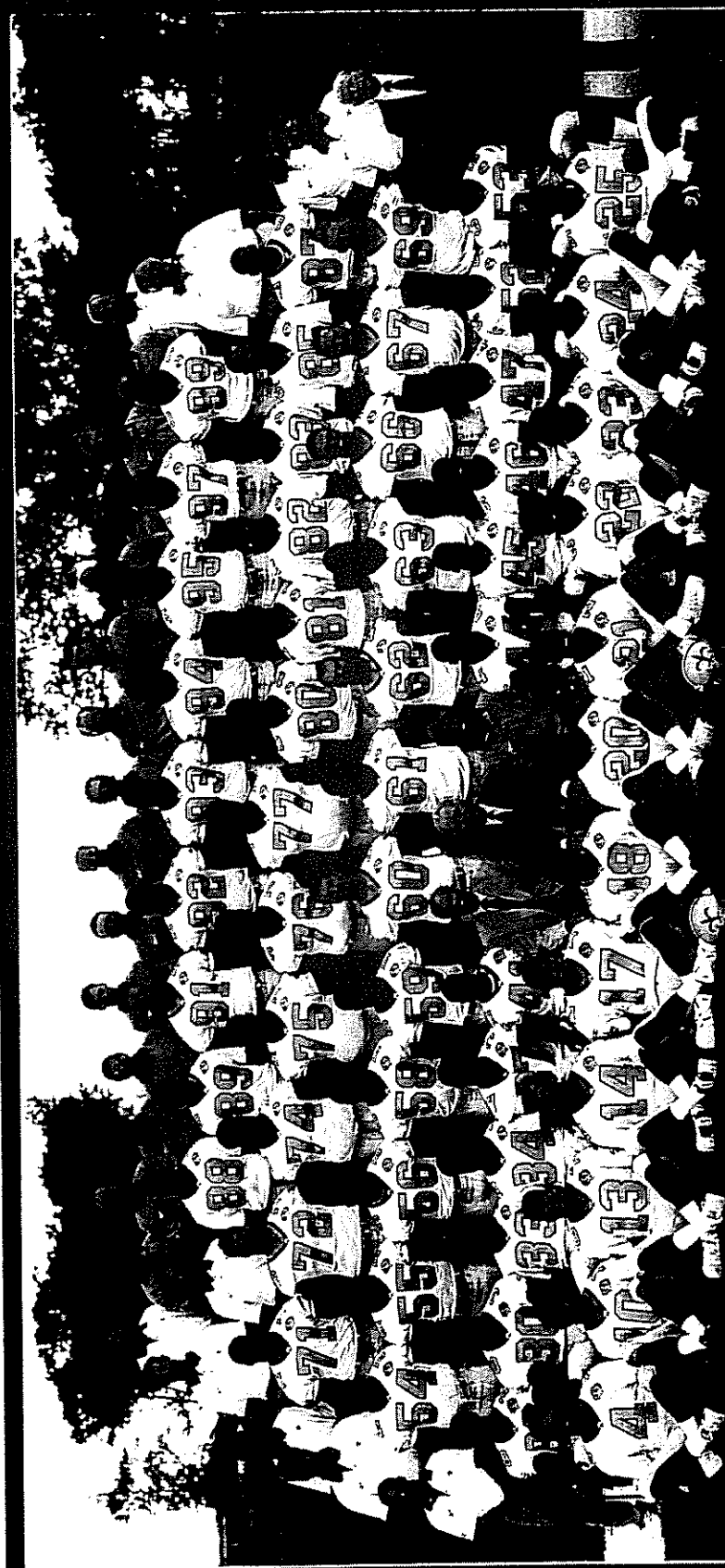

HISTORY OF CLOGGING

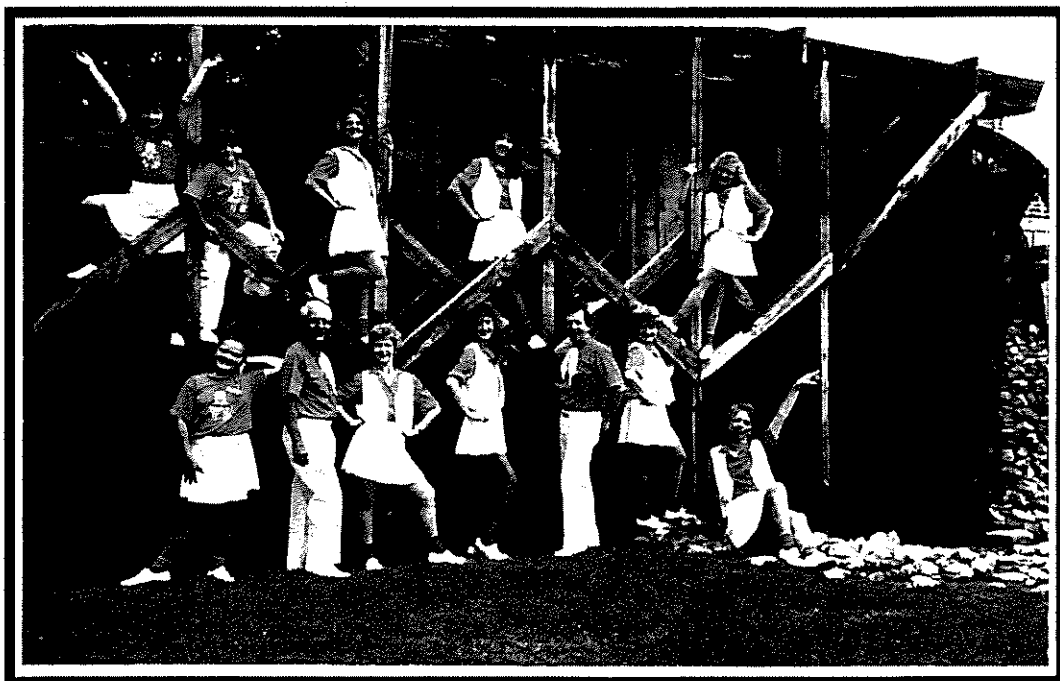
"The American clogging and mountain dance heritage, especially that of more recent times, has been influenced by many sources. The clogging steps themselves are predominantly a blending of the English, German, Scotch, and Irish step dances and black African steps and styling. The dance structures themselves bear strongest resemblance to Irish, but also Scotch and English dances. Both the steps and the dances have had minor influences from a host of other nationalities, mostly from northern Europe."

"Clogging during the entire dance by all the Dancers did not become commonplace until the 1930's at Bascom Lamar Lunsford's annual Mountain Dance and Folk Festival in Asheville, North Carolina."

Traditional steps and figures were and are still very regional and constantly in a state of change and improvisation by the individuals who dance them.

Clogging was a unique Southern Appalachian folk dance, gaining impetus during the Western Square Dance explosion during the late 1940's and 1950's, and today can be found in every U.S. state and nearly every province in Canada !

Sociologists tell us that as we approach the 21st Century, people will want to return to and examining the things of the past - that there will be a desire for the simpler things in life. Today's cloggers, with their emphasis on old fashioned family values, good clean fun, exercise and fitness, and enduring friendships, will lead the way!



CLOGGING

(for friendship, fun, fitness & family)

Clogging is our national heritage dance and is rapidly growing in popularity around the world. This is a lively dance done as much to please the dancer themselves as to delight audiences!

If you have ever wanted to learn to clog, now is the time. It has been said "If you can tap your toe in time to music, you CAN learn to CLOG !"

Originally done to old time string music cloggers dance today to bluegrass, country, pop, jazz, or rap music - anything with a good lively beat ! Cloggers affix taps to their shoes to emphasize the beat of the music. Some even become their own instruments and dance a capella beating out an individual rhythm with their feet.

Clogging classes are uniquely suited to whole family participation from toddlers to Senior Citizens, and since partners are not required, singles and couples are all made welcome.

Beginning cloggers start out slowly, of course, learning basic steps and combinations of steps. The camaraderie of class night and new friends plus the benefit of exercise as the new dancers gradually pick up the pace, will make learning to clog the most anticipated night of the week.

As a clogger progresses in skill, there are wider horizons if desired. Clogging workshops, performance, exhibition or competition teams for all ages travel to local, state or national conventions. There are opportunities to clog almost anywhere in the United States, Canada and in several foreign countries - notably Australia and Germany.

Dear Bowlers and Fans,

My name is Walter Gendron III. I was born in New Orleans, Louisiana. At the age of three months, I became deaf from scarlet fever. I attended Chinchuba, a private oral school in New Orleans before transferring to Model Secondary School in Washington D.C. During my college years, I was active in sports, educational and student organizations. I have extensive employment experiences in working with the deaf (including counseling, teaching, coaching, advising, and advocating); and also I was involved in a great deal of volunteer work.

For a number of years, I had a dream. And a vision to implement a very much needed project that will touch millions of people's lives around the world. In my mind's eye, I saw myself visiting places where many people did not know existed, and going to the homes of the "lost" deaf people/children who are alienated, neglected, and wrongfully treated by their families, peers, and/or the government. Many of them live in poverty and were stripped of any chance on getting the proper education or support for them to lead a productive life. I saw myself seeking and reaching out to these people by pinpointing their location, do research on what they have/do not have and the needs to be met in order for them to lead an independent and productive lives. Documentation on these research of their cultures, civilization deprivation, and personal contacts with the deaf people/children will be done with extensive photography, and journalism which will produce a book called "Deaf Children of the World". The purpose of this book is to make their cultures known as a reality with hopes for others who are more fortunate and in a position to help in some ways.

The National Fraternal Society of the Deaf (FRAT), Division #33, is a non-profit organization, founded in Chicago, ILL; FRAT offers services to meet the needs of the deaf and hearing consumers throughout the United States, as well as the Greater New Orleans area. FRAT sponsors the "Deaf Children of the World" project and the promotion of the book from the beginning.

I traveled throughout several countries for two years: Mexico, Central America, South America, and a large portion of Africa. The deaf children that I have encountered and their unique cultures I studied gave me the most valuable and enriching experiences in my life which is beyond belief. These experiences which I gained through these travels include visits at deaf schools in their native hometown, stays at the homes of the native deaf families, and studies of their unique communication method in their native sign language/gesture styles. The most amazing thing that I experienced is that no matter which town or which country you are in, the common thread that

connects yourself as a deaf person to these people as other deaf persons create a strong bond and understanding of the barriers, struggle in our day-to-day lives. I was able to identify with their needs and frustration and they, too, were able to identify with mine as if we all knew each other from long ago or from another life.

This project was initiated to do research in attempt to locate deaf people/children in the world and to put their location on the map and their living situations known to the rest of the world. My travels were put to a halt for the time being due to lack of funding and I hope to resume my travels again in the summer of this year to try to complete this project in less than 4 years. The countries that I plan to do further research on will be the Middle East, Russia, China, and lastly, Asia. I anticipate that with my traveling methods and sufficient funding, it will take close to four years to complete before publishing the book.


The book, "Deaf Children of the World" will play a vital role in everyone's lives, both hearing and deaf people. It will entail valuable information on the locations and culture findings, insights, photography and journalism on deaf children; and in promoting this book, I hope it will educate the people as a whole and bring good fortunes to help these deaf people/children who are less fortunate to lead a better life in their own countries.

This project survives solely on funding, grants, and donations from organizations, families, and friends. However, I am seeking additional sponsorship in order to raise sufficient funding to help with the completion of this project. I am eager to provide a presentation at the D.D.B.A. Bowling Tournament and this presentation will be based on all the journeys I made throughout Mexico, Central America, South America, and most part of Africa; and I will also talk in details about how I traveled with little or almost no money, and how I roughed it out by staying at the homes of the local deaf families in different countries. Videotapes, and photographs will be displayed at the booth and in the presentation.

Please do take a few minutes of your time to visit the booth called "Deaf Children of the World" and I will be happy to explain about this project further with you.

DIXIE DEAF BOWLING ASSOCIATION

CONSTITUTION 1997

ARTICLE 1 - NAME AND LOCATION:

This organization shall be known as the Dixie Deaf Bowling Association (a.k.a. D.D.B.A.). The location of this organization shall exist in the states of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia and West Virginia

ARTICLE 2 - OBJECTIVES:

SECTION 1 - This organization shall conduct an annual tournament, "American Ten-Pins" of Dixie States Championship during the Memorial Day weekend in May for the four (4) man teams, five (5) games individual event, the all events and the Robert Kolb Masters.

SECTION 2 - This organization shall encourage and foster among its members and those interested in the sport and the spirit of good fellowship.

SECTION 3 - This tournament shall be governed by the rules and regulations outlined by the American Bowling Congress (a.k.a. A.B.C.), with any additional rules deemed necessary.

SECTION 4 - This organization shall be non-profit as specified under the charter issued by U.S. internal Revenue Service (IRS - 501-c3)

ARTICLE 3 - MEMBERSHIPS:

There shall be membership.

ARTICLE 4 - OFFICERS:

SECTION 1 - The officers shall be a President, a Vice President, a Secretary/Treasurer, three (3) By-Laws Committee members and a Hall of Fame Chairman.

SECTION 2 - The non officers shall be a three (3) Hall of Fame Committee members, a Recording Secretary and three (3) Auditors.

ARTICLE 5 - MEETINGS:

SECTION 1 - An Annual Board of Directors meeting shall be held on the Friday night of May.

SECTION 2 - The Executive Committee meeting shall be held at least once a year before the annual Board of Directors meeting.

ARTICLE 6 - AMENDMENT:

This Constitution may be amended by a two-third (2/3) vote of all regular members voting at the regular meeting upon the recommendation of the Board of Directors. The proposed Amendment having been previously submitted in writing and read to the Organization at least sixty (60) days before being voted upon.

Note: The Suspension of the above Articles of this Constitution is prohibited

* = It was voted and passed by the Board of Directors' meeting last year, effect this year unless in parenthesis.

D.D.B.A. BY-LAWS
1997

ARTICLE 1 - MEMBERSHIP:

SECTION 1 - REGULAR MEMBERSHIP: A regular membership must be available to any deaf or hard of hearing bowler and must provide full rights and privileges with no exclusions.

SECTION 2 - YEARLY DUES: The yearly dues for regular membership shall be governed and be set by D.D.B.A. and reported in the minutes. See Expenditures guideline.

SECTION 3 - MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION: An applicant for membership shall complete (in black or blue ink) a D.D.B.A. bowling entry form furnished by the Secretary / Treasurer.

ARTICLE 2 - ELECTION OF OFFICERS:

SECTION 1 - The Elected Officers:

a) - An elected officers shall be a bona fide resident of the D.D.B.A. as named in the Constitution, Article I.

b) - Elected Officers shall include a President, a Vice President and a Secretary/Treasurer.

SECTION 2 - The Non-Elected Officers: A Recording Secretary, three (3) By-Laws Committee members and a Hall of Fame Chairman.

SECTION 3 - TIME OF ELECTIONS:

a) - Elected Officers shall be elected at the annual Regular Board of Directors meeting in May.

b) - The President and the Vice President shall be elected in an "ODD" year for a two (2) years term, start at the beginning of the next "EVEN" year.

c) - The Secretary / Treasurer shall be elected in an "EVEN" year for a four (4) years term, start at the beginning of the next "ODD" year.

d) - Any officers who have not bowled during the tournament for a good reason, shall be allowed to remain as an officer, with an approval of the Executive Committee.

SECTION 4 - ELECTION ELIGIBILITY:

a) - Any regular Board of Director member in good standing for at least three (3) consecutive years before the election day shall be eligible for election.

b) - No elected officer shall hold more than one (1) elected office.

SECTION 5 - BALLOTS:

a) - All officers shall be elected by the secret ballots.

b) - A majority vote shall be necessary to be elected.

c) - If a majority vote is not reach on the first ballot with at least three (3) candidates, a second ballot involving the two (2) candidates with the highest numbers of votes from first ballot shall be taken and voted again.

SECTION 6 - OATH: The newly elected officers shall be sworn in immediately after their election and shall take office effective a conclusion of the Board of Directors meeting. The oath of the Officers is as follows:

"I do hereby pledge myself to abide by the Constitution and the By-Laws of D.D.B.A. and to faithfully perform the duties of my office to the best of my knowledge and ability"

SECTION 7 - RELINQUISHMENT: When officers relinquish their offices, all properties, papers and monies in good order belonging to the office of the President, Vice-President, Secretary/Treasurer, By-Laws Committee members, Hall of Fame Chairman, Hall of Fame Committee members, Recording Secretary and Auditors shall be turned over their respective successors.

D.D.B.A. BY-LAWS

ARTICLE 3 - DUTIES of the OFFICERS (Cont.)

SECTION 4 - CHAIRMAN of BY-LAWS (Vice-President) SHALL;

- a)- Appoint three (3) By-Laws Committee members (two (2) states if possible) with an approval of the President.
- b)- Carry out and enforce all objectives of D.D.B.A.
- c)- Settle any protests or disputes according to the Constitution and By-Laws. The final decision rests with the Executive Committee and must adhere to the A.B.C. Laws.
- d)- Keep members fully informed of all new laws and their purpose.
- e)- Send any proposals from the bowlers to the Executive Committee at least thirty (30) days before the Board of Directors meeting.
- f)- Send the proposals that were passed by the Executive Committee to the Board of Directors to be considered for approval.
- g)- Have the power to transact and / or oversee all necessary laws business or law communications in the interest of D.D.B.A. and with the Executive Committee of D.D.W.B.A. in order for the interest of D.D.W.B.A.

SECTION 5 - BY-LAWS COMMITTEES SHALL; (See Article 3-Section 4a)

Meet with the Executive Committee any time before the Board of Directors meeting to oversee any change of amendments, laws or rules in the interest of D.D.B.A.

SECTION 6 - HALL of FAME CHAIRMAN SHALL; (See Article 3-Section1h)

Appoint three (3) Committee members who are interested in the welfare of D.D.B.A. and establish the guidelines with an approval of the Executive Committee.

SECTION 7 - EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE SHALL;

- a)- Consist of the seven (7) officers (Article 3- Section 1, 2, 3, 5, & 6).
- b)- Attend and vote with Board of Directors at any meetings of the body. However, any individual, whether he is a member of the Executive Committee, the Board of Directors or both may be allowed only one (1) vote on any question at such meeting.
- c)- Have the authority to transact all necessary business of D.D.B.A. between meetings
- d)- Recommend investments of D.D.B.A. from time to time.
- e)- Supervise the general and special funds.
- f)- Act as a grievance committee whenever referred any complaints or disagreements between members. They shall report their results or make recommendations to the members. The decision will be final.
- g)- Have full power to act in any and all emergencies.

SECTION 8 - BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL;

- a)- Be composed of all Executive Committee, a Representative, the General Chairman of present host toumey, former DDBA President as a member at large and the Captains of all teams entered in the present toumey.
- b)- Be vested with the control and management of the annual toumey. By a majority vote, it may delegate its authority in whole part or in part to the Executive Committee.

SECTION 9 - RECORDING SECRETARY SHALL; (See Article 3-Section 1g)

- a)- Write the minutes of all kinds of meetings in the ink or typewritten in paged numbers and make the copies to be sent to each member of the Executive Committee for correction within thirty (30) days after the meeting.
- b)- Report on refund of security fund and any donations of the host city bid to financial reports.

SECTION 10 - AUDITOR SHALL; (See Article 3-Section 1g)

Examine and audit all the D.D.B.A. accounts and financial affairs of the present fiscal year with the Secretary / Treasurer and sign the Financial report any day before the Board of Directors meeting.

D.D.B.A. BY-LAWS

ARTICLE 3 - DUTIES of the OFFICERS:

SECTION 1 - PRESIDENT SHALL;

- a) - Be principal executive officer of D.D.B.A.
- b) - Preside at all Executive Committee and Board of Directors meetings of D.D.B.A.
- c) - Enforce strict observance of D.D.B.A. Constitution, By-Laws and any rules.
- d) - Countersign the minutes reports of all meetings.
- e) - Keep the Bond of Treasurer's bank for safe keeping.
- f) - Inform the Host City Chairman of the coming tournament at all expenses and related arrangements that are expected from the Host City by D.D.B.A.
- g) - Appoint the Recording Secretary and three (3) Auditors (one from out of state and two from local) with an approval of the Secretary/Treasurer.
- h) - Appoint the Hall of Fame Chairman with an approval of the Executive Committee.
- i) - Appoint vacant officers with the approval of the Executive Committee until next election.

SECTION 2 - VICE PRESIDENT SHALL;

- a) - Perform all the functions of the President in the President's absence.
- b) - Be a By-Laws Chairman.
- c) - Be in charge of the Robert Kolb Masters Tournament.
- d) - Oversee all necessary business or communications for the Robert Kolb Masters event.

SECTION 3 - SECRETARY / TREASURER SHALL;

- a) - Keep the minutes of all Executive Committee, By-Laws Committee, Board of Directors and special meetings of D.D.B.A. Such minutes are to be dated and recorded in books with proper numbered.
 - b) - Keep copies of the Constitution, By-Laws and any rules.
 - c) - Make these minutes available when requested.
 - d) - Receive and keep an original register of members, regular and privileged.
 - e) - Keep the records of all scores made in all tournament held by D.D.B.A.
 - f) - Have charge of all D.D.B.A.'s books and records.
 - g) - Conduct necessary correspondence.
 - h) - Have sole charge of conducting the annual tournament with the approval of the Executive Committee
 - i) - Conduct the annual tournament along the lines as the American Bowling Congress's yearly event.
 - j) - Make own arrangements with assistants at the tournament city and hire necessary clerical help.
 - k) - Go to the tournament city to finalize plans, such as signing contracts with the bowling establishment, inspect the headquarters site and meet with local committee.
 - l) - Must review and the printed flyer proof two (2) years before the host city sends out to the public.
 - m) - Make room reservations for all Executive Committee.
-
- aa) - Act as Treasurer to open an account (to be known as the Dixie Deaf Bowling Association) in a reliable bank of his residence city.
 - bb) - Be bonded for the full amount of the bank deposits at the expense of D.D.B.A.
 - cc) - Have sole custody of all funds of D.D.B.A.
 - dd) - Pay all the bills and state a purpose of each which are signed with the President.
 - ee) - Collect all donations, fees, dues, security, penalties, assessments and debts from members or any others and give receipts for the same amount.
 - ff) - Deposit in the account of all monies received from ("ee")
 - gg) - Turn over to the Executive Committee a statement showing the outcome of the tournament by July 31st.
 - hh) - Make the fiscal year report to the Board of Directors at the meeting.
 - ii) - Be provided with authority to set the prize fees as he sees fit.
 - kk) - Determine the exact amount of the prizes.

D.D.B.A. BY-LAWS
1997

ARTICLE 4 - MEETINGS:

SECTION 1 - DATE and LOCATION:

- a)- The annual Board of Directors meeting shall be held in the tournament city during the progress of a tournament on Friday night of May.
- b)- The Executive Committee meeting may be called by the President at his discretion and shall be held before the Board of Directors meeting. Notice of such meeting shall be sent in writing two (2) weeks prior to the meeting.
- c)- The Executive Committees meeting shall be on Friday afternoon at the hotel.

SECTION 2 - QUORUM:

- a)- One-half (1/2) of all qualified captains entered in the tournament who are present at the meeting on time shall constitute a quorum.
- b)- Majority of the qualified captains present may transact business of D.D.B.A.
- c)- In the absence of a quorum at any meeting, no business shall be officially transacted.
- d)- Any business may be suspended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of members present.

SECTION 3 - ORDER of BUSINESS:

The regular order of business of D.D.B.A. shall be as follows:

- 1)- Pledge to the flag
- 2)- Silent prayer (if needed)
- 3)- Roll call
- 4)- Reading of all minutes and financial reports
- 5)- Reports of officers (in order)
- 6)- Reports of committees or chairman of present tourney
- 7)- New business (new proposals from Executive Committee must be approval by the Board of Directors members)
- 8)- Election of officer(s)
- 9)- Selection of tournament city
- 10)- Announcements, subject to the approval of the President
- 11)- Adjournment

SECTION 4 - AMENDMENTS:

- a)- Any proposals of change or add the laws, amendments or rules must be made in written to the Vice-President (Chairman of By-Laws) between, after the new business during the Board of Directors meeting and at least sixty (60) days before the next year Board of Directors meeting, Vice-President then shall send copies of proposals to the Executive Committee at least thirty (30) days before the Board of Directors meeting and this said Committee shall discuss and vote on the proposals before the Board of Directors meeting starts.
- b)- The By-Laws and rules may be amended or repealed by a majority vote of the Executive Committee with (2/3) of the Board of Directors members vote at the Board of Directors meeting.

ARTICLE 5 - DISSOLUTION:

SECTION 1 - TEAM DECLINATION:

- a)- In the event that the teams of D.D.B.A. should dwindle to eight (8) or fewer, the question of dissolution shall be submitted to the membership for consideration.
- b)- Special notice shall be given to every members at least thirty (30) days prior to the meeting. Turnover shall specifically state the questions of dissolution that will be taken up at the meeting.
- c)- The affirmative vote of at least two-third (2/3) of the members in good standing shall be required to pass such a motion of dissolution.

SECTION 2 - PROPERTIES:

- a)- Whenever the members of D.D.B.A. shall vote for dissolving D.D.B.A., the officers shall dispose of all furnitures, fixtures and any personal property belonging to D.D.B.A.
- b)- D.D.B.A. shall pay back the future hosts who have deposited with D.D.B.A.
- c)- D.D.B.A. shall pay all outstanding obligations and debts in full.

SECTION 3 - DONATION:

After obligations in Article 5 - Section 2-b & c have been meet. All monies, bonds, certificates or any property belong to D.D.B.A. left over upon dissolution shall turned over to the _____), shall place such monies, certificates and bonds into its endowment fund. The income and interest derived there from is to be used to defray the _____ expense that can be recognized by D.D.B.A.

ARTICLE 6 - TOURNAMENT CITY:

SECTION 1 - HOST CITY BID SHALL;

- a) - Be a bona fide organization, which shall be referred to us as the tournament city. It must be located in the territory described in D.D.B.A. 's Constitution Article - 1. (page 1)
- b) - Have been represented by at least one (1) team (a minimum of 2 competing bowlers from the same organization) for three (3) consecutive years prior to it's tourney bid.
- c) - Provide an A.B.C. sanctioned establishment having at least thirty two (32) alleys. A letter signed by the management of establishment verifying the exact numbers of alleys reserved, also the dates and time.
- d) - Be required to have Saturday night's entertainment located in the headquarters hotel which must provide a minimum capacity of one hundred (100) reserved rooms. The ballroom must have a minimum capacity of four hundred (400) or more persons. A letter signed by the management from the establishment verifying the date will be required.
- e) - Be given the opportunity of placing the bids before the Board of Directors by each city who nominated with their propositions.
- f) - Be decided by ballot at the annual Board of Directors meeting held during the progress of the tournament. Said selection is for four (4) years in advance.
- g) - Win the bid by a majority vote. If a majority vote is not reached on a first ballot, a second ballot involving the two (2) nominees with the highest number of votes from first ballot shall be taken.
- h) - See the **Guidelines / Expenditures: Section 2 - a).** (page 8)

SECTION 2 - HOST CITY SHALL;

- a) - See **Guidelines / Expenditures: Section 2 - b) to l).** (page 8)
- b) - Must bring their proof printed publicity flyers to the D.D.B.A. Secretary / Treasurer for an approval two (2) years before the date of their tournament.
- c) - Have the General Chairperson submit monthly reports of it's progress to the D.D.B.A. Secretary / Treasurer beginning with the month of December preceding the tournament.
- d) - Send out the advertising matter of the forthcoming tournament at least ninety (90) days prior to the date of the tournament.
- e) - State guaranteed cash prizes for first place of each event and circulated said statement.
- f) - Field an extra team to make possible an even-number of entries, should an odd-number of teams in a tournament occur. The D.D.B.A. is to pay for the alley fees of said team, which will be ineligible for any share of the prize list. The captain of the mixed team shall be selected by the Secretary / Treasurer.

ARTICLE 7 - MISCELLANEOUS:

SECTION 1 - BOWLING EVENTS:

- a) - The events will be classified as the 4 Man Team, 5 Games Singles and Robert Kolb Masters in order.
- b) - The events will occur on the following days : Saturday - the 4-Man Team and 5 games Single Event. Sunday - Robert Kolb Masters events.
- c) - The bowler's handicap shall be based on seventy percent (70%) (by calculator or computer) of the difference between his average and 210 (excluding the Robert Kolb Masters).
- d) - No individual handicap shall exceed 42 pins per game.
- e) - The deadline for the entry of Four (4) Man Team, Singles exclude Robert Kolb Masters shall be at least thirty (30) days prior to the tournament date start.
- f) - A bowler must play on the Four Man Team to qualify for Singles and Robert Kolb Masters.
- g) - The Captain of team will be responsible to communicate the dress code to their bowlers, if the captain does not communicate the dress code to the bowlers, and he will be fined \$5.00.
- h) - No team or individual shall be entitled to a refund after the entry blank and fees have been received by the Secretary / Treasurer. In case of illness or death, a bowler or team may be replaced anytime prior to the tournament.

SECTION 2 - BOWLER SHALL;

- a) - Be a member of the A.B.C.. If not, he must pay the membership fee to the D.D.B.A.. Secretary /Treasurer and provide the true highest average. Not be eligible to compete more than once in any event.
- b) - Not be a member of Professional Bowler Association (a.k.a. P.B.A.). If he has left P.B.A. more than two (2) years, he may bowl scratch for two (2) years before starting to use the regular average with handicaps.
- c) - No high school boys are to participate in this tournament.
- d) - Forfeit his entry fee and prize winnings if he falsified the average and did not report any prize winnings within the past twelves (12) months.
- e) - Dress in a shirt with a collar and sleeves and trousers, approved by one any from the Executive Committee. No cap or hat is allowed.

ARTICLE 7 - MISCELLANEOUS (CONT.)

SECTION 3 - THE ROBERT KOLB MASTERS EVENT:

- a) - Bowler who bowl in all events in the D.D.B.A. annual tournament are eligible to bowl in the Robert Kolb Masters.
- b) - Shall be held in conjunction with the annual tournament on a actual basis.
- d) - All games bowled are counted toward standings for the prize monies.
- e) - The qualifying rounds of the Robert Kolb Masters tournament must start on Sunday at 9:00 A.M. and complete on that day
- f) - The deadline for entry shall be at least thirty (30) minutes prior to the start.
- g) - Bowlers are recommended to pay the entry fee with the regular team entry form at least thirty (30) days before the tournament start otherwise, they should pay the penalty fee of five dollars (\$5.00) for a late entry fee between the team deadline and thirty (30) minutes before the start of the tournament. The penalty fees will be use for the prizes toward the Robert Kolb Masters.
- h) - This tournament is conducted like the A.B.C. Masters except that the qualifying rounds is limited to four (4) games across eight (8) lanes.
- i) - If there are any tied bowlers, a roll-off shall be made in the 9th and 10th frame to determine the winner.
- ? j) - First place will collect at least ten dollars (\$10.00) per head prize as per total of bowlers entered.

GUIDELINES / EXPENDITURES:

SECTION 1 - D.D.B.A. SHALL;

- ? a) - Pay the sum of fifteen cents (.15) per mile to the President and Secretary / Treasurer for their transportation expenses for any reason affiliate with this organization.
- b) - Pay three (3) night for three (3) Law Committeemembers on the basis of 50% to 50% between the host city and D.D.B.A.
- c) - Pay the Secretary / Treasurer the sum of .50 from each bowler per event entered except the Robert Kolb Masters.
- d) - Pay three (3) Auditors fifteen dollars (\$15.00) each.
- e) - Pay the Recording Secretary twenty five dollars (\$25.00).
- g) - Have the Secretary/Treasurer make room reservations for all Executive Committee.
- h) - Use the interest earned from the host donation fund, prize fees collected and the regular saving account to award the winners, the exact amount of the prizes to be determined by the Secretary / Treasurer.
- ? i) - Determine the tournament expense amount, maximum to be three (\$1.50) per game.
- ? j) - Collect the prize fee based on per event, minimum fee is five dollars (\$5.00) per game.
- ? k) - Entry fees (prize, expense and alley) total per event shall be in dollars bracket. If have the coins, add extra coins for prize fee to made it in dollar bracket.
- l) - Separate the bowling and tournament expense fees from the entry fees.
- ? m) - Collect a minimum one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.) from the host city during the tournament, no matter how many bowlers and fans have entered.
- ? n) - Collect and give ten dollars (\$10.00) from each bowler for the registration fee to the host city.
- ? o) - Collect and give six dollars (\$6.00) from the bowlers for the ballroom admission to the host city.
- ? p) - Not be responsible for any debt incurred by the host city. This agreement shall be printed in the contract between the D.D.B.A. and the host city.
- * q) - Send the Representative (one from Executive Committee only) to NDBA with variable expense on each reasonable distance.
- r) - Collect \$5.00 as membership dues from Bowlers and shall be used for one (1) year subscription to the Dixie Deaf Bowler Newsletter.

SECTION 2 - HOST CITY SHALL;

- ? a) - Pay eight hundred dollars (\$800.) and other monies for prizes to D.D.B.A. at the time of nomination. The eight hundred dollars (\$800.) will be split in half. The first half will go to the Host Bid Fee and other half will go to the Security Fund.
- ? b) - Pay four hundred fifty dollars (\$450.) to D.D.W.B.A. according to the By-Laws of D.D.W.B.A.
- ? c) - Refund the Security Fund with understanding the host city has faithfully sent team(s) (a minimum of 2 competing bowlers from same organization) to D.D.B.A. tournament every year after winning as well as the year after their own tournament.
- ? d) - Pay the penalty of four hundred dollars (\$400.) for each missed year.
- ? e) - Pay the installment payment for the first place team prize and other prizes. The balance must be paid in full at least two (2) years before the start of their host city tournament.
- ? f) - Pay D.D.B.A. a minimum of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.) during the tournament.
- g) - Donate the award plaques to all winners in actual pin fall in the Team, Singles, All-Events and Robert Kolb Masters. In case of tie, the host city shall award plaques to the co-champions.
- ? h) - Award other plaques to other winners of Handicap events, if host city desire.
- i) - Be responsible for printing costs of the day, the schedule, the prize list, statistics of bowlers records of the tournament, the advertising, stationery & any expenses in program book say 5 1/2 by 8 1/2 maximum size.
- j) - Be responsible for the mailing expenses of the program booklets to the Executive Committees and the Captains. Sufficient copies shall be supplied to the D.D.B.A. Secretary / Treasurer.
- k) - Earn proceeds from the sale of the program booklets which shall become the property of the host city.
- l) - Provide complete rooms for the President, the Vice-President and Secretary/Treasurer three (3) nights.
- m) - Pay three (3) night for 3 Law Committeemembers on the basis of 50% to 50% between the host city and D.D.B.A.

Constitution and By - Laws

Re-organized in 1974

Name changed in 1985 -

Dixie Women's Bowling Association of the Deaf

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I - - NAMES

- SECTION 1.** This organization shall be known as Dixie Deaf Women's Bowling Association embracing the state of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia and West Virginia.
- SECTION 2.** Any other state groups wishing to do so, may have entries in the Annual Tournament, but may not host.
- SECTION 3.** Whenever the DDBA adds a new state to the organization, it is automatically added to the DDWBA also.

ARTICLE II - - OBJECTS

- SECTION 1.** The DDWBA is formed for the following objects and purpose:
- (A) To hold, direct or under its direction and auspices, conduct and manage annually a Dixie Deaf Women's Bowling Association.
 - (B) This tournament shall determine the Dixie Champions of four (4) women's teams, individual, all events and Queens, said tournament to be governed by the Women's International Bowling Congress with such other rules as necessary not conflict herewith.
 - (C) To encourage and foster among its members, those interested in the sport, the spirit of good fellowship.

BY - - LAWS

ARTICLE I - - MEMBERSHIP

- SECTION 1.** All regularly organization bowling team composed of the female sex from any state in the United States, who are deaf, partially deaf and are qualified under the rules of the WIBC are eligible from membership in this organization. A team may have any number of "hearing" bowler provided all deaf spouse (no single hearing women).
- SECTION 2.** Age limit of any women entering the DDWBA tournament shall be 18 and over. None shall be Students in schools (exclude any college).
- SECTION 3.** The hearing children of deaf parents may bowl in this tournament.
- SECTION 4.** Membership in this Dixie Deaf Women Bowling Association shall be three dollars (\$3.00) per year payable with entry fee.
- SECTION 5.** They shall be members of WIBC.
- SECTION 6.** They shall pay annual membership dues.

ARTICLE II - - ORDER OF BUSINESS

SECTION 1. The regular order of business at all meetings of the association shall be described:

- 1) Call to order
- 2) Prayer and salute to the flag
- 3) Roll call of Captains and Officers
- 4) reading of previous minutes
- 5) Reports of Officers and communication in order
- 6) Reports of committees - - chairlady etc.
- 7) Unfinished Business
- 8) New Business
- 9) Announcement of the next tournament chairlady
- 10) Elections of Officers
- 11) Good of order – Bank Night
- 12) Adjournment

ARTICLE III - - OFFICERS & BOARD OF DIRECTORS

SECTION 1. The officers shall consist of a President, Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer, three Board of Directors, and Hall of Fame. These seven (7) shall also serves the Executive Board.

SECTION 2. The President shall be elected for a term of 4 years. Term to begin right after the preceding tournament in the even year.

SECTION 3. The Vice-President shall, in the absence of the President perform the duties of that office Vice-President shall be elected for a term of 4 years, same as the president. She also serve as head of the Law Committee.

SECTION 4. The Secretary-Treasurer combined shall be elected for a term of 4 years. Term to begin same as the President.

SECTION 5. The Recording Secretary appointed by the President at the meeting shall assist the Secretary-Treasurer at the Annual meeting. The Recording secretary shall make 3 carbon copies of the minutes and leaves 2 copies with the Secretary and the President. She shall type and mail a clean copy to the Secretary within 30 days.

SECTION 6. Any officer is not permitted to hold more than one office. Any officer with a good reason for bowling during her term shall be allowed to remain in office.

SECTION 7. All officers and their duties shall be chosen to the conformance of the duties of the WIBC.

SECTION 8. To be eligible for office , you must attend three (3) consecutive general meetings, prior to election.

SECTION 9. Any officer shall be in Board meeting. She shall be notified to one of Executive Board members. So she can be replaced by one of At-Large member.

ARTICLE IV - - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

- SECTION 1.** The President shall preside at all meetings. The President shall fill any vacancies that occur during the tournament.
- SECTION 2.** The Vice-President (Law Chairlady) shall in the absence of the President, perform the duties of that office and preside at the Law Committee Meetings, she shall read and explain all proposed changes and new amendments at the meetings.
- SECTION 3.** Secretary-Treasurer shall keep an accurate record of the proceedings of all meetings; conduct all correspondence. She shall receive and deposit all monies in a bank in her hometown in the name of Dixie Deaf Women's Ass'n., which may be withdrawn only on checks by herself. Secretary-Treasurer shall keep a true and correct account of all the receipts and disbursements, and shall make an annual report to the Board of Directors. Secretary-Treasurer shall distribute prizes to the captains by checks within 30 days, after close of the tournament.
- SECTION 4.** Election of #3 Board of Directors shall be held annually. #1 Director drops out upon election of #3, #2 moves up to #1 spot.
- SECTION 5.** The Secretary/Treasurer shall hold bond.
- SECTION 6.** Secretary mail out the minute one week before the tournament.
- SECTION 7.** Any bowler from any state, outside of state can become an officer after attending these consecutive tournament but her state can not host a tournament.
- SECTION 8.** Secretary/Treasurer can claim for phone bill only February 15-May 31. President can have right call personally any or bonds.
- SECTION 9.** The Board of Directors shall consist of three (3) officers of the DDWBA and 2 member of the committee.
- The 3 directors shall perform the duties of the trustee and audit the Treasurer's book annually, as headscoreers. The Law Committee along with the Vice - President, shall oversee the proposed changes, new amendments to our constitution and By - Laws.

ARTICLE V - - AMENDMENTS

- SECTION 1.** The Constitution, By laws and rules may be amended or repealed by a 2/3 vote of the members of the quorum voting at the annual meeting, provided that such amendments shall have been submitted in writing to Vice-President of this organization before such annual meeting of the board
- SECTION 2.** Any proposal of changes of laws or amendments must be made in writing to the Vice-President thirty (30) days before tournament date.
- SECTION 3.** The association shall have the power to enact such by - laws as it may necessary for it's effective organization and operation.
- SECTION 4.** Constitution and by - Laws changes are to be referred to DDWBA Vice-President of consideration sixty (60) days prior to the DDWBA bowlers' meeting for approval.
- SECTION 5.** Discussion on the non profit organization form 501 - C3 as for the tax purpose. The Tax exemption.

ARTICLE VI – TOURNAMENT RULES

- SECTION 1.** The tournament shall be sanctioned and conducted according to the rules and regulations of the Women International Bowling Congress (WIBC) unless otherwise arranged with the Congress by the Secretary-Treasurer.
- SECTION 2.** All prizes will be awarded on a handicap basis of 80 percent of 180, 52 pins per below per game limit.
- SECTION 3.** Any and all complaints, protests and constitutions as to score bowled shall be made within one hour after the game in question have been bowled, in writing to the Secretary-Treasurer to be taken up with the executive Board.
- SECTION 4.** The Secretary-Treasurer is required to give receipts to all persons who send monies. Statements of expenditures and deposited are required to be submitted by the auditors.
- SECTION 5.** All WIBC bowlers present at the annual meeting shall have voice and can vote. Late comers into meeting can't have voice; DDWBA dues must be paid before a bowler can bowl.
- SECTION 6.** All bowlers must xerox their WIBC cards and sent to Secretary along with entry blanks.
- SECTION 7.** The entry fees shall be in postal money orders, express money orders, certified checks, Association checks or bank drafts (no personal Check allowed) must accompany the completed entry banks. Fee less than the full amount will not be accepted.
- SECTION 8.** Any Bowlers who has received a prize of \$350 or more in any event of a tournament within 12 months to date of the tournament must report to the Secretary-Treasurer for possible rerate. Failure to do so can lead to forfeiture of this tournament prize.
- SECTION 9.** Secretary-Treasurer has full power to make decisions not to conflict WIBC by laws on tourney rules. She has the right to rerate the average if anyone shall not tell that she has won \$300 within 12 months with her sanction membership of WIBC.
- SECTION 10.** In case of a tie for first place in team event, one game roll off to determine the championships. The cost of the roll off to be paid out of the DDWBA's general Fund.
- SECTION 11.** In event of a tie in singles, a 5 frame roll off for championship will be held. If still tied after 5 times— it must go on until tie is broken. Bowling fees will paid out of DDWBA's General Fund.
- SECTION 12.** (A) Teams shall be bowled on Saturday morning at 9 a.m. and singles shall be bowled on Saturday at 1 p.m. (B) Queens shall be bowled on Sunday all day. Qualificiy round shall be at 9 a.m. and roll off shall be at 1 p.m.
- SECTION 13.** Plaques will be awarded to first place Handicap Pin Championship at said hotel on said date. This Also must be the entry blanks.
- SECTION 14.** All bowlers must pay for Combo as prior the DDWBA rules also accompany the entry blanks.
- SECTION 15.** One shadow ball allowed on each lane before Team, Singles and Queen event.
- SECTION 16.** No bare midriffs, shorts, fade denim jeans, tanks, legging not allowed. Blue jeans, Bermuda, shorts, blue jeans shorts above knee, coulotte all by 3 inches are allowed. Bowlers who disregards this rule will be fined \$5.00.
- SECTION 17.** If Bozo must be used, the score will be 10 per cent off her average. Her handicap remains the same.

- SECTION 18.** Special prize of \$50.00 to be awarded to any Senior citizen over 55 years old with highest All Event Score. ½ of the Prize fees be shared even with DDWBA and the Host City.
- SECTION 19.** In case of National Crisis, the Host City can have their deposit refunded. Secretary-Treasurer must be notified by February 15 of tourney year.
- SECTION 20.** The name(s) of whose are in Hall, can be eligible at meeting anytime, no matter if they are not bowlers any longer.
- SECTION 21.** Prize ratio to each 4 entries in team and single events. One (1) prize for each 10 entries in all events.
- SECTION 22.** All prizes fees in this tournament will be 100 percent.
- SECTION 23.** Participants may only once in each events, if wish to bowl in queens, must enter team and singles too.
- SECTION 24.** It shall be each bowler's responsibility to verify the accuracy of her average in handicap or classified tournaments, whether originally submitted by the bowler, her captain or others.
- SECTION 25.** Failure to use the correct average shall disqualify score if submitted average is lower than correct average thereby result in a lower classification or more handicap. Prize winnings shall be based on the submitted average if it is higher than the correct average, however, corrections in averages may be permitted up to the completion of the first game of a series WIBC Rule 363a-3.
- SECTION 26.** WUBC and non-WBIC member may participate in a Regular Sanctioned tournament with high score recognition automatically extended to WIBC members. Eligible non-league bowlers may qualify for high score recognition at their option by pay \$20.00 fee for which the Congress will issue an unattached membership card.
- SECTION 27.** Premature termination of the tournament brought about by war, national emergency or emergency causes relating therefrom, fire natural disaster or any other reason beyond the control of the (name of tournament or sponsoring group) shall cause, to the extent required thereby all advertised prize, guaranteed or otherwise, to be prorated in accordance with the number of entrants who have bowled in each of the respective events up to the time of such termination.
- SECTION 28.** Use highest WIBC sanctioned average, 21 games or more of ____ season. If no average is available for ____ use highest WIBC sanctioned average, 21 games or more as of March 1st, _____. If the _____ average is 10 or more pins above the _____ average the current March 1st _____ average must be used. WIBC Rule363A2.
- SECTION 29.** Bowlers who have neither a current average nor an average from last year must bowl at 165 average. Any bowler who reports a lower average than required or who fails to report a prize of \$300 or more, won within the previous 12 months shall forfeit tournament entry fee and prize winnings.
See below for Re-rating system.
- SECTION 30.** Between two (2) teams should be from different state at Bowling Lanes during the tournament.

D..D.W.B.A.'S Re-rating System

- SECTION 1.** (A) Pins will be added to your average: Winning must be \$300 or more per event. Within 12 months from this date-
 (B) Rerate must follow by WIBC.
 (C) This rule replaces WIBC rule 362a in our Tournaments.
 (D) The tournament and classic should report the secretary for winning prize.
 (E) All the bowlers must send secretary because record of winning money, prizes along with entry form.

ARTICLE VII - - TOURNAMENT CITY

- SECTION 1.** The city in which the annual tournament is to be held is decided by the Dixie Deaf Women's Bowling Association (DDWBA). The chairlady must be a bowler or ex-bowler.
- SECTION 2.** The sponsoring host must deposit 25% (one-fourth) of the total prize money at the same time as the DBA receive the winning bid. The sponsor shall pay 25% 1/4 of the prize money until paid in fourth of next coming tournament. Host City will be fined \$50.00 after deadline on DDWBA and its deadline will be by 30th of April. Pay in full before start of the tournament which is in April.
- SECTION 3.** The Secretary-Treasurer shall be notified within six months if the tournament city is unable to hold the tournament, therefore the prize money deposit shall be forfeited and automatically turned over to the next holding tournament city.
- SECTION 4.** The Host city sponsoring the tournament shall print the schedule, prize list of the tournament in their program books.
- SECTION 5.** Plaques, stationery and all advertising shall be at the expenses of the tournament city.
- SECTION 6.** A \$100 penalty will be imposed to Host City for not sending flyers and prize monies when due by December.
- SECTION 7.** Entries close at midnight on a given date 45 days prior the coming tournament. No entry fees refunded unless one is replaced.
- SECTION 8.** The General Chairlady of the tournament committee shall send a scratch flyer to the Secretary in the month of December Preceding the tournament.
- SECTION 9.** General Chairlady is requested to send final flyers and host reservation cards to Secretary by Feb. 1st preceding the tournament.
- SECTION 10.** Host City is requested to pay for the President's transportation to tournament, ½ of this expense is to be borne by the DDWBA and ½ by Host City.
- SECTION 11.** The Host is requested to pay for Secretary-Treasurer's transportation to the tournament city; ½ of this expense is to be borne by the DDWBA and ½ by the Host City. The Secretary-Treasurer shall furnish either her airline ticket or gas receipts.
- SECTION 12.** Host City is requested to pay the President, Vice-President and Secretary-Treasurer' hotel room during their stay, limit 2 nights.
- SECTION 13.** Host City must send a representative or a team to the tournament to show their interest in coming tournament.
- SECTION 14.** The Secretary-Treasurer shall inform the Host City Chairlady of the coming tournament all expenses and related arrangements that are expected from the Host City by DDWBA. This shall be done in January prior to their tournament.
- SECTION 15.** Host City must see that the bowling establishing has proper arrangement for the coming tournament and a meeting room provided for ball and bag storage overnight under lock. 50 cents will be charge for overnight rental. Money goes to DDWBA General Fund.
- SECTION 16.** In event tournament acquires an uneven number of teams. Secretary shall ask Host City to form a dummy team and expenses for bowling fees shall be paid out of the DDWBA General Fund.

ARTICLE VIII - - SALARY AND EXPENSE

- SECTION 1.** (A) The Secretary/Treasurer shall receive a salary of \$10.00 per team and \$1.00 singles on the Queen If a tourney is not held any one year. Her salary shall be \$15.00 for that year. This is paid from the General Fund.
- (B) The Vice-President and her committee (2 others) shall be paid \$5.00 each from the general fund. The recording secretary shall receive \$5.00 for the work at night.
- (C) The Board of Directors Each shall receive \$5.00 for their work scores.
- SECTION 2.** In event, the President or Vice - President or Secretary/Treasurer stay a third night if needed, it paid by DDWBA.
- SECTION 3.** Hall of Fame chairlady get one free night, per each committee receive.

ARTICLE IX - - HALL OF FAME

- SECTION 1.** The electors shall be follows bowlers who enter tournament for Hall of Fame.
- SECTION 2.** Nominee must meet the following requirements as a Bowler.
- SECTION 3.** Nominee must have participated in at least eight (8) tournament of D.D.W.B.A. to be eligible for nomination.
- SECTION 4.** Shall chairlady, the Hall of Fame - 2 Committee with one member of the advisory board to over see nomination and selection bowler.
- SECTION 5.** Hall of Fame from Secretary/Treasurer shall provide space in the souvenir book to be used for the purpose of listing former members who have participated in a least eight (8) tournament and who have died since the last only ballroom.
- SECTION 6.** Hall of Fame recipient shall receive a plaque, complimentary ballroom pass and DDWBA membership card that shall permit her to attend all events.
- SECTION 7.** Chairlady will present to Bowler "Hall of Fame Plaque" at the ballroom.
- SECTION 8.** Hall of Fame received awards and can go to the meeting who pay DDWBA member fees.

ARTICLE X - - OATH OF OFFICERS

- SECTION 1.** I _____, do solemnly promise to obey and follow the constitution and by - laws of the Dixie Deaf Women's Bowling Association and to fulfill the duties as an officer to the best of my ability.
