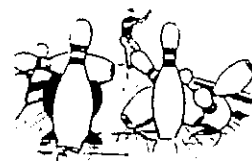

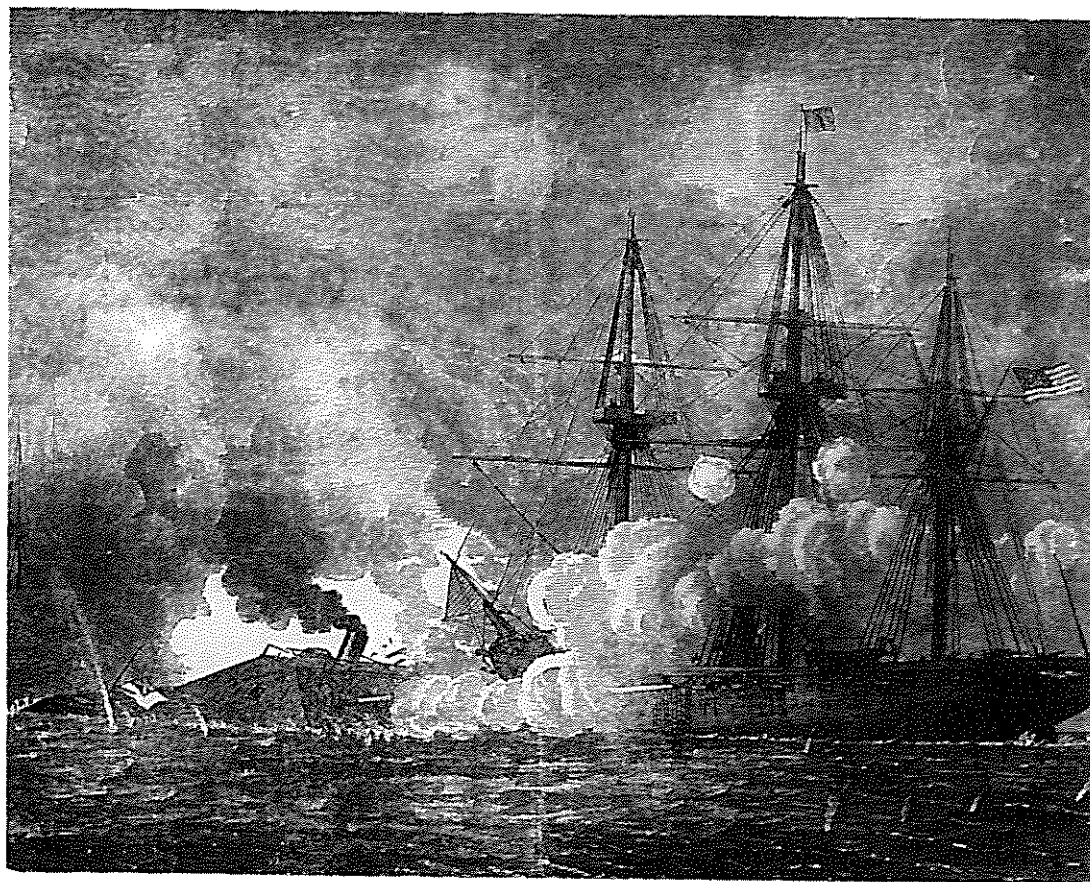



We hope that you find time to enjoy our many recreational and cultural facilities, and you may even want to visit our nearby sandy white beaches on the Gulf of Mexico.

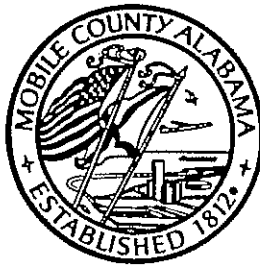

"Folly" chases away Death on the traditional Order of Myths Mardi Gras emblem float.

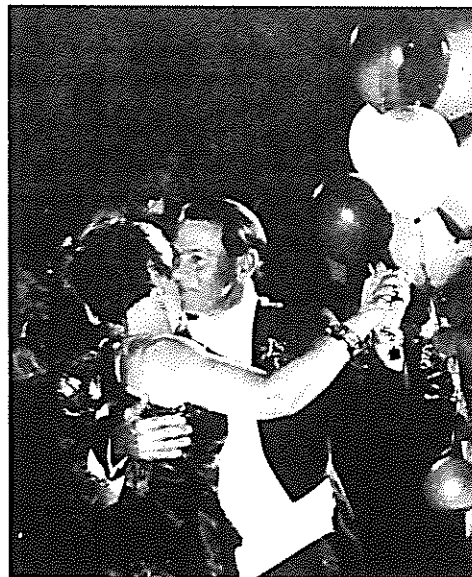
Every year a madness descends upon the otherwise normal citizenry of Mobile as tens of thousands of people take to the streets nightly to jostle one another for plastic trinkets and marshmallow confections, tossed to them by masked men or women riding elaborate floats. These good folk haven't really taken leave of their senses, they are merely celebrating the pre-Lenten revelry known as Mardi Gras.

Starting approximately two weeks before Ash Wednesday, the "Season" begins with extravagant night-time parades that wind through the historic downtown area of this old seaport. Each evening, as the parades reach the end of their route, members of the Mystic Societies and their guests attend glittering Mardi Gras balls, where white tie and tails are *de rigueur*.

The pace quickens as Mardi Gras (literally, "Fat Tuesday") approaches. The Sunday before Mardi Gras is known as Joe Cain Day and has been dubbed as "the people's Mardi Gras." Joseph Stillwell Cain is the man credited with reviving Mobile's Mardi Gras tradition in 1866 by dressing as Chief Slacabamorinico (Chief Slac) and driving a mule wagon through town as his friends celebrated. Today Joe Cain Day sees

as many as 200,000 Mobilians and visitors parade through downtown and celebrate the festive season.

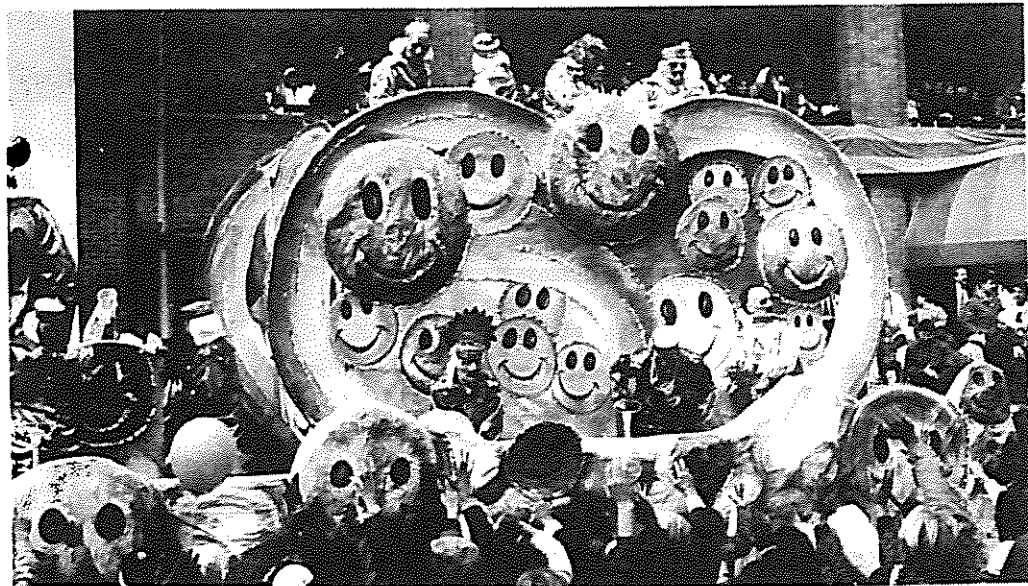

Ash Wednesday marks the end of Mardi

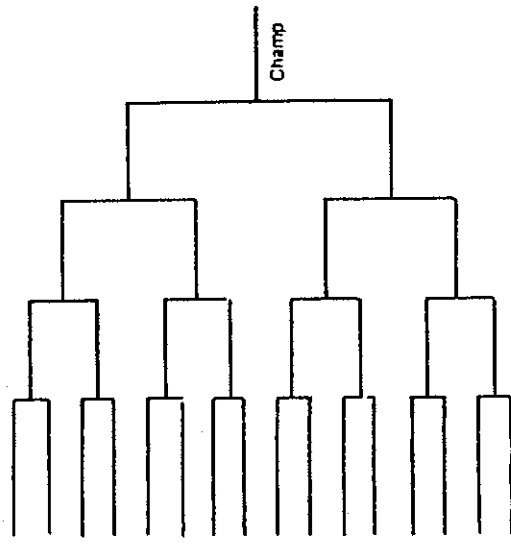
Gras as the somber season of Lent begins, and the faithful look toward the Easter celebration.

Mardi Gras has its roots in Europe, where it is celebrated as "Carnival." When the French settled Mobile in the early 1700s, they brought Carnival with them. While Mardi Gras celebrations in New Orleans have become more famous, the tradition started in Mobile and has been going strong ever since. 🍪

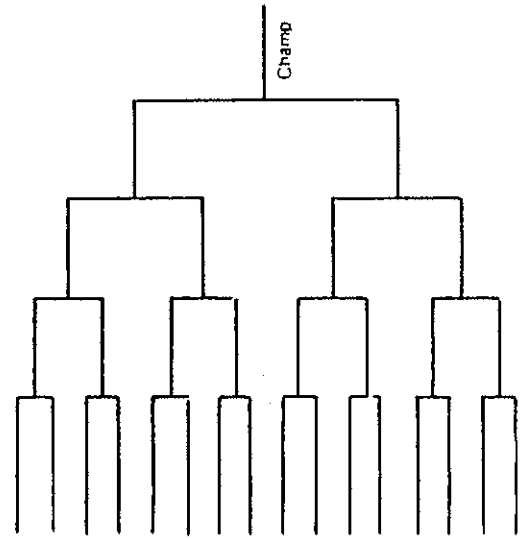
