This year it is time for the election of officers of D.D.B.A. I enjoyed being president and I would like to run for the office of president again this year.

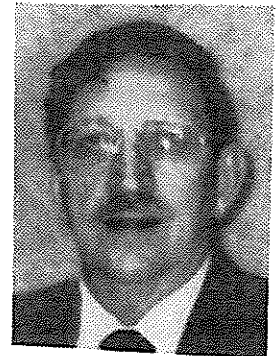
