IN MEMORANDUM

ADDIN LIGHTBODY

FEBRUARY 13, 1908 - JANUARY 21, 1987

Eight months after being inducted in the Dixie Deaf Bowling Association Hall of Fame, Addin Lightbody quietly passed away in a Jacksonville hospital after an illness of three days. Addin was extremely proud of his award. A long-time dream had come true! The award now hangs in the home of his oldest daughter, Pat Smith, in Lubbock, Texas in accordance with his wishes.

Addin was born in Jacksonville on February 13, 1908 and spent all of his life in his hometown. He received his formal education at the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind in St. Augustine. At age 15 he decided to drop out of school in favor of helping his father haul tall pine logs on a barge down the St. Johns river. Addin was of Cherokee Indian descent and loved the great outdoors, the sun, the sky and the river. His father taught him how to catch fish for the dinner table while the barge floated lazily down the river to its destination. Thus fishing became a life-long love affair.

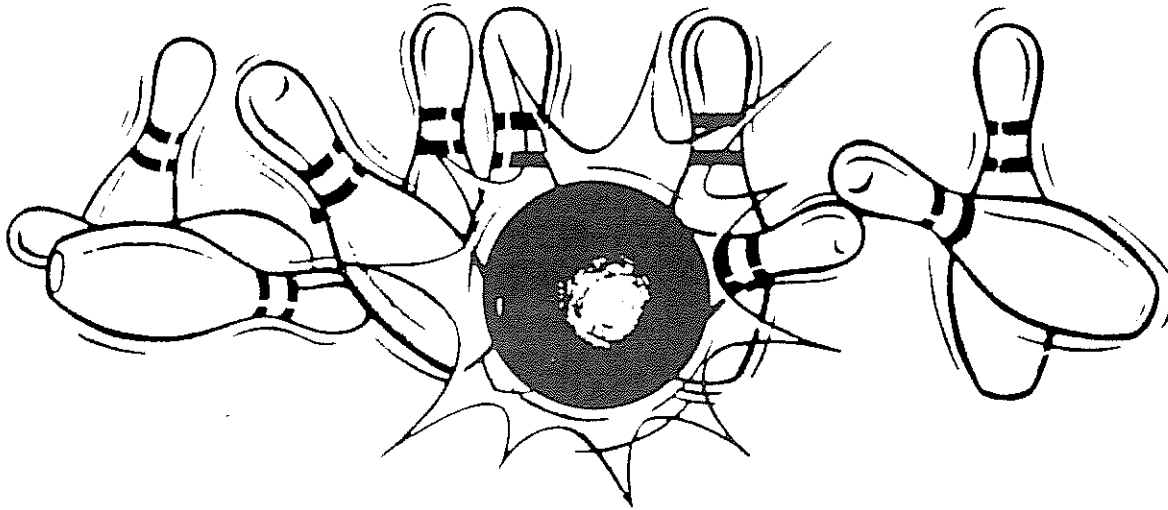
When he was 18 years old and riding a motorcycle, he was involved in an accident which resulted in an injured foot among other things. Addin was not too concerned about the injured foot and did not seek extensive medical help. As a result, gangrene set in and his leg had to be amputated just below the knee. He was outfitted with a wooden "peg leg" until years later technology invented a better and realistic leg for him. Not many DDBA bowlers were aware the tall and simple man they bowled with had an artificial leg. Addin walked with a slight limp but that was all.

Most of his adult life was spent in the outdoors as a carpenter. At age 58, he had to take disability retirement on account of his leg. After his second wife, Rose Miller, passed away, he was at loose ends until he met and married Jeanette Austin on April 7, 1976. He set up a successful part-time file saw business which helped to supplement his disability income. Having time on his hands, he became more active in bowling and was a member of a year-round local weekly senior citizen's bowling league. He was a member of the Florida Bowling Association of the Deaf and the Dixie Deaf Bowling Association for many years. Faithfully, he attended their tournaments when possible.

Straight at 6'4" and weighing 200 pounds, Addin had three loves in life - first, his family . . . second, bowling and third fishing. He loved life and it was good to him. He had many friends who enjoyed his easy-going company and his witty conversation. This tall and gentle man was a great guy! We shall miss him.
