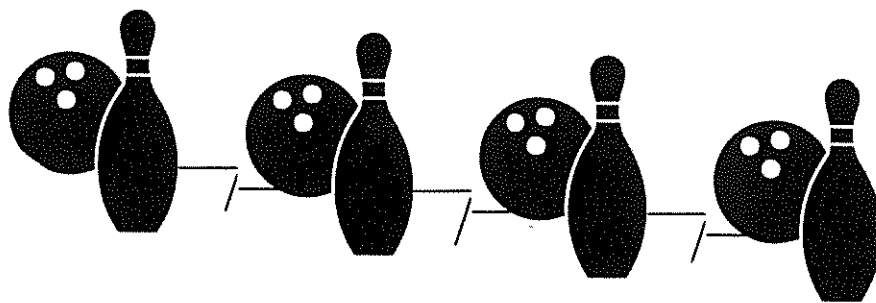

AMERICAN BOWLING CONGRESS

The game of bowling in the United States is an indoor development of the more ancient outdoor game that survives as lawn bowling. The outdoor game is prehistoric in origin and probably goes back to Primitive Man and round stones that were rolled at some target. It is believe that a game something like nine-pins was popular among the Dutch, Swiss and Germans as long ago as A.D. 1200 at which time the game was played outdoors with an alley consisting of a single plan 12 to 18 inches wide along which was rolled a ball toward three rows of three pins each placed at the far end of the alley. When the first indoor alley were built and how the game was modified from time to time are matters of dispute.

It is supposed that the early settlers of New Amsterdam (New York City) being Dutch, they brought their two bowling games with them. About a century ago the game of nine-pins was flourishing in the United States, but so corrupted by gambling on matches that it was barred by law in New York and Connecticut. Since the law specifically barred "nine-pins", it was eventually evaded by adding another pin and thus legally making it a new game.

Various organizations were formed to make rules for bowling and supervise competition in the United States but none was successful until the American Bowling Congress (ABC) organized September 9, 1895, become the ruling body.

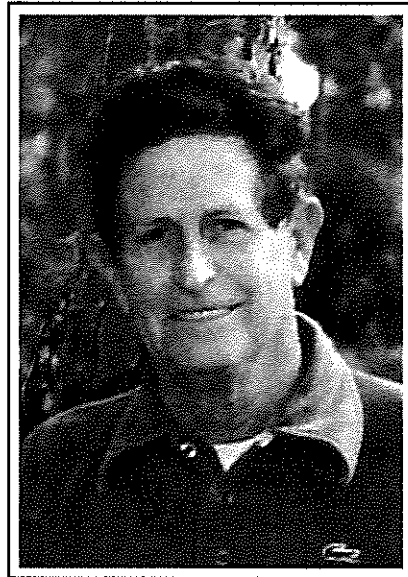

Do You Know About These....?

In the U.S. there were 8,031 bowling establishments with 151,312 lanes in 1986-87 and about 68 million bowlers.

The World's largest bowling Center (now closed) was the Tokyo World Lanes Center, Japan, with 252 lanes. Currently the largest center is Fukuyana Bowl, Osaka, Japan, which has 144 lanes.

The standard-sized ball is 27 inches in circumference and weighs 16 1/2 pounds; smaller sizes and weights also are available.

CANDLEPINS and **DUCKPINS**: There are two interesting variations of the game of bowling (tenpins). One known as *candlepins*, is played in the same way and with the same sized bowling ball as tenpins, but the *candlepins* are in the general shape of a candle, long, narrow and nearly straight from bottom to top.

The other variation of bowling is a game called *duckpins*, played with very much smaller pins and balls about the size of croquet balls. The rules, scoring and procedure are as in bowling. This game is especially attractive for women and children since they can get from it practically all the sport of bowling, but without the strain of handling a heavy ball.

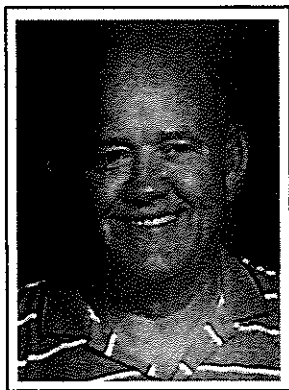
WELCOME TO ALL PARTICIPANTS

ORIGINS OF BOWLING

Bowling can be traced to articles found in the tomb of an Egyptian child of 5200 B.C. where were nine pieces of stone to be set-up as pins at which a stone "ball" was rolled. The ball first had to roll through an archway made of three pieces of marble. In the Italian Alps about 2,000 years ago, the underhand tossing of stones at an object is believed the beginnings of *bocci*, a game still widely played in Italy and similar to bowling. Martin Luther is credited with the statement that nine was the ideal number of pins. In the British Isles, lawn bowls was preferred to bowling at pins. In the 17th century, bowling at pins was the national sport of Scotland Early British settlers probably brought lawn bowls to the U.S. and set up what is known as Bowling Green at the tip-of Manhattan Island in New York, but perhaps the Dutch under Henry Hudson were the ones to be credited.

In 1841, the Connecticut state legislature prohibited the game and other states followed. Eventually, a tenth pin was added to what had all along been a 9-pin games, to evade the ban.
