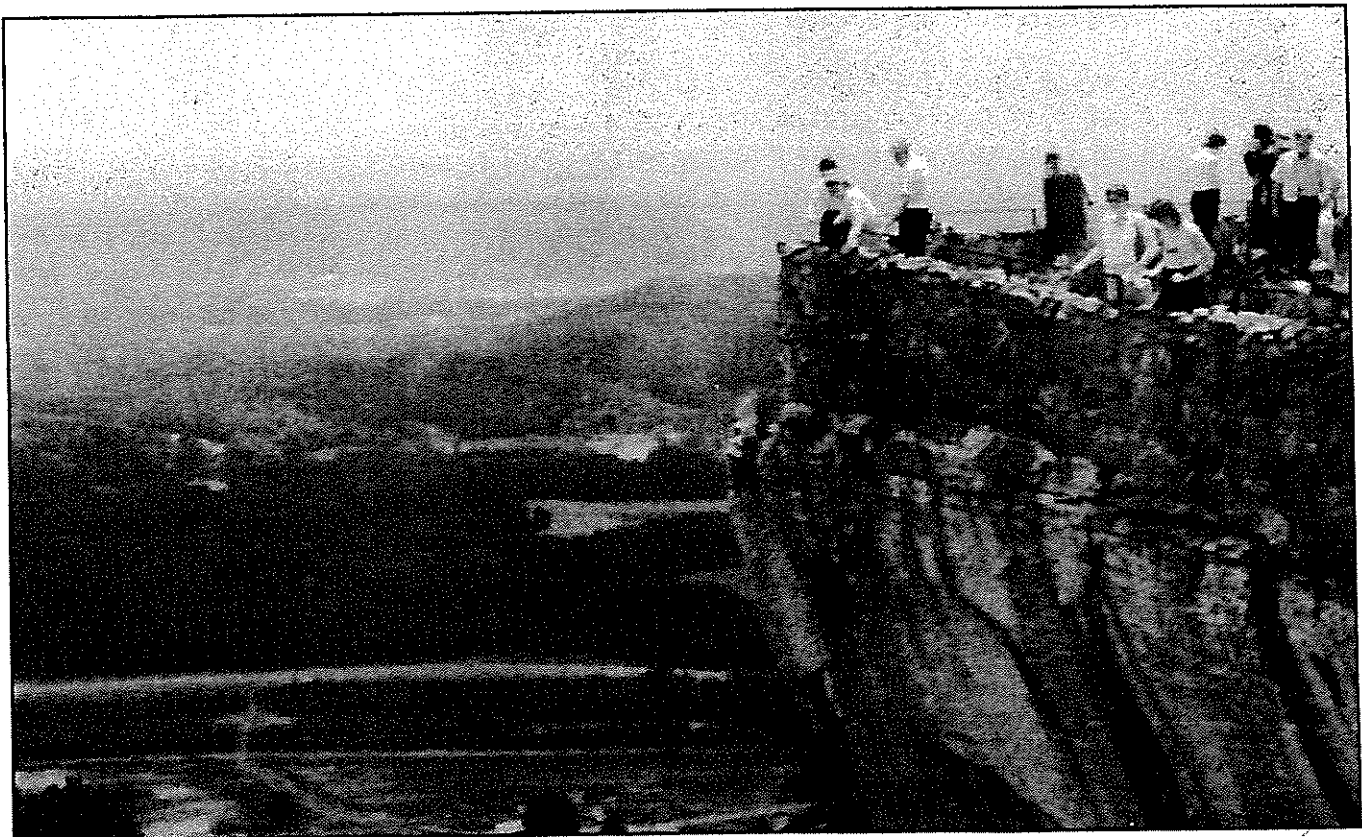

A HISTORY OF THE DIXIE DEAF BOWLING ASSOCIATION

In order to get an idea of how the Dixie Deaf Bowling Association began, it is necessary to go back to 1949. In that year the Southeastern States Bowling Association of the Deaf (SSBAD) started more or less as a fun tournament between a Miami team and a Jacksonville team as well as the Jacksonville team vs. an Atlanta team. There was no rules and regulations nor even an organization title. In 1950, the five deaf bowling teams from Florida and the other deaf teams from Georgia competed in the second SSAB tournament. Prior to the competition, a group of deaf bowling stalwarts gave birth to the idea of organizing an annual tournament with ABC sanction. Then the group proposed and adopted the following:

- 1.) have the name changed to Dixie Bowling Association of the Deaf, embracing the states of Alabama, District of Columbia, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia, and West Virginia,
- 2.) formulate its Constitution and By-Laws by which all future annual tournaments and meetings would be conducted,
- 3.) obtain American Bowling Congress sanction for every annual tournament and to abide by its rules, and
- 4.) run the annual bowling tournament on a handicap basis.

At this historic meeting, the Dixie Bowling Association of the Deaf was formally organized with Todd Hicks of Jacksonville, Florida was its first president, Henry B. Oaks of Atlanta, Georgia as its first vice president, and Charles McNeilly, Jr. of Miami, Florida as its first secretary-treasurer.

The first annual bowling tournament of the newly-organized Dixie Bowling Association of the Deaf was held in Atlanta, Georgia on October 27-28, 1951 with six entries, three from Atlanta and one each from Miami and Jacksonville, and a newcomer, Birmingham, Alabama. At the meeting prior to competition, it was decided to change the date of the next annual tournament from the month of October to the month of April. Due to inexperience and unfamiliarity with ABC rules and regulations, a sanction for this tournament was not obtained. Top prize for the first place winners, the Atlanta Club of the Deaf team which included Douglas Hitchcock, Don Turner, Lee Cofe, Henry Oaks, and Mack Padgett was \$16.00. Herbert Dannis of Birmingham, Alabama was the first singles event champion with the score of 670 pins, and he was also all-events champion with a total of 1772 pins. C. Pollock and Maurice Samples, the deaf Floridians were the first doubles event champion with 1246 pins total. Mack Padgett bowled a scratch high game of 222 pins.

The second DBAD annual bowling tournament was held in Birmingham on April 19-20, 1952, with sanction by ABC for the first time. Seven teams participated -- Memphis, Tennessee, being the newcomer. Birmingham Silents was the team event champion with 2811. The tournament was ably managed by Rush Letson, and it marked its milestone, printing its first DBAD souvenir and program book.

Jacksonville was the site of the 1953 DBAD tournament, and a number of entries increased by one over the previous tournament. Birmingham Silents was the team event winner for the second straight year.

In 1954, the tournament was held in Miami. Only eight entries were received, same as the previous tournament. The Hialeah Shoe Repair team of Miami walked away with the team event and the \$100.00 cash prize donated by Miami and Atlanta clubs, rolling a high of 2924 pins.

The tournament was held in Atlanta for the second time in 1955. Thirteen teams entered; Louisville, Kentucky being the newcomer. The Atlanta Deaf Keglers won the team event.

In 1956, the tournament was held in Birmingham for the second time and as was their previous tournament in 1952, it was highly successful. Birmingham Silents again won the team event.

For the first time in DBAD history, the tournament was held in Louisville, Kentucky in 1957 where a record cash prize of \$150.00 was donated by the sponsor. The Louisville Association of the Deaf drew 16 teams, the largest in the short history of the DBAD.

In 1958, Jacksonville for the second time sponsored the tournament, with 10 entries. The only

newcomer was Tampa, Florida. Atlanta Deaf Keglers won the five-man team event.

Again, in the year of 1959, the tournament was sponsored by Miami, with the disappointing number of nine entries. Two newcomers were Winter Haven, Florida and Tallahassee, Florida. The team event went to South Florida Stars who edged out the Jacksonville Strikers 'n Spares by four points.

In 1967, the states of Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia, and the District of Columbia were dropped from the DDBA membership roll. No data as to why they were dropped from the roster is available due to loss of minutes from the fifties to early seventies. Arkansas was added to the roster in 1973.

In the year of 1968, the DDBA Hall of Fame was established to honor the individuals in the bowler and leader categories. First in the HoF in bowler category was Lee Cofe of Georgia, and first recipient in the leader category was Sam B. Rittenberg of Alabama. The following bowlers, who helped organize the DDBA in 1950, were inducted into the Hall of Fame: Todd Hicks as a bowler in 1977; Henry Oaks as leader in 1969 and as bowler in 1970; Douglas Hitchcock of Georgia as a bowler in 1972 and as a leader in 1978; Charles McNeilly, Jr. as a leader in 1974.

The annual tournaments continued until 1975 where the 25th annual DDBA tournament was suspended due to the National Bowling Association of the Deaf and its annual World Deaf Championship in Knoxville, Tennessee. The DDBA resumed with the 1976 tournament in Birmingham.

In 1977, Louisville, Kentucky hosted the DDBA tournament with 65 team entries, 126 entries for the doubles event, and 252 entries for the singles event. Again in 1982, Louisville club hosted the tournament with 49 team entries and 95 singles entries. Charles Lyons of Chicago, who participated at this tournament, brainstormed the idea of organizing the first Masters tournament and presented the rationale for his new idea to appeal to the fans as well as bowlers. The popularity of this competition has grown every year. At the board of directors meeting, he made a motion to have the Masters tournament conducted at each annual DDBA tournament. The motion passed without any opposition. Robert Kolb, tournament chairman, conducted the first ever Masters tournament. Leslie Massey of Indianapolis, Indiana was the first Masters champion. Then, the Masters tournaments would be managed by the host chairperson every year until 1979 when it was decided by the DDBA board of directors to take over the Masters tournament at each DDBA annual tournament. Unfortunately, there are no records available to indicate the names of the past Masters champions from 1978 until 1990. Daniel Krpata of Virginia became the only two-time Masters champion in 1991 and 1992.

In 1990, West Palm Beach Association of the Deaf hosted the 39th annual DDBA tournament with 40 team entries. Virginia applied for the membership in the DDBA and was accepted unanimously by the members of the Board of Directors.

The Dixie Deaf Bowling Association hosted the 40th Anniversary tournament in Louisville, Kentucky. The prize purse goal was first reported \$40,000.00 for men, but it was reduced to \$8,000.00 due to huge task of fundraising.

It was known that Casimer Podgorniak of Syracuse, New York, whose average was in the 200's during the fifties and sixties, was the singles event champion in both handicap and scratch categories and was the all-events champion also. Bill Hayse of Decatur, Alabama, who now maintains a 200-plus average in several bowling leagues, was the singles event champion at the 33rd Annual DDBA tournament in Tampa, Florida.

Under the guidance of dedicated DDBA officers, law committee members, and other bowling stalwarts, a well-planned program of organization and expansion was built up through the years.

This history of the DDBA was gathered from the program books and records of minutes that were available.

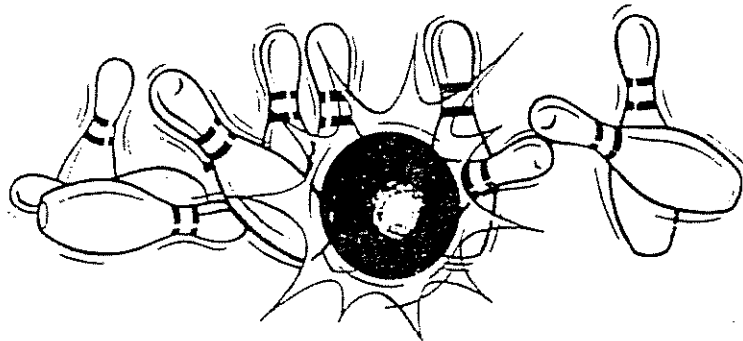

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I - NAME AND PURPOSE

SECTION I. This organization shall be known as Dixie Deaf Bowling Association, embracing the states of Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Kentucky, Arkansas, and Virginia.

SECTION II. The Dixie Deaf Bowling Association, hereafter referred to as the Association, is formed for the following purposes:

- (a) To hold, direct, or under its direction and auspices, conduct and manage annually a Dixie Deaf Bowling Association Tournament.
- (b) This tournament shall determine Dixie Champions for: four-man team; five game individual event; and all events. Said tournament is to be governed by the rules and regulations as outlined by the American Bowling Congress (ABC), with such other rules as necessary not in conflict therewith.
- (c) To encourage and foster among its members and those interested in the sport, the spirit of good fellowship.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I - MEMBERSHIP

SECTION I. All regularly organized bowling teams composed of the male sex from any state in the United States who is deaf, partially deaf, or son(s) or/ husband(s) who can hear, but are familiar with the language of signs and must be members of city clubs or state association and carry active membership cards.

SECTION II. Membership in the Dixie Deaf Bowling Association shall be five dollars (\$5.00) per year payable with entry fee.

ARTICLE II - ORDER OF BUSINESS

SECTION I. Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the proceedings of all meetings of this Association when not inconsistent with the provisions of this Constitution.

SECTION II. The regular order of business shall be as follows:

1. Call to order
2. Roll call
3. Reading minutes and action thereon
4. Reports of officers in order
5. Reports of committees
6. Unfinished business
7. New business
8. Secelction of tournament city
9. Election of officers
10. Announcements subject to approval of the President
11. Adjournment

ARTICLE III - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

SECTION I. The Board of Directors shall be composed of the captains of all teams entered in the tournament.

SECTION II. The Board of Directors shall be vested with the control and management of the annual tournament and by a majority of vote may delegate its authority in whole and in part to the executive committee.

SECTION III. The annual meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held in the tournament city during the progress of this tournament. At such a time as the President may designate and at such meetings shall elect their officers and promulgate tournament registrations for the coming years.

SECTION IV. Two-thirds of all captains entered in the tournament who shall be present at the meeting on time shall constitute a quorum. Two-thirds (2/3) of said captains, so present, may transact any and all business of Association.

SECTION V. All past presidents, vice presidents and secretary-treasurers shall be admitted to meetings as life members.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

SECTION I. The officers shall consist of a president, a vice president, a secretary-treasurer, a recording secretary, and a publicity director who will automatically represent the Executive Committee which includes the General Chairman of the pending tournament.

SECTION II. Candidates for any office except a position of the publicity director must have attended three (3) consecutive board meetings prior to nomination for officer as verified by roll call records. Any candidate for the publicity director may be a deaf or hard-of-hearing active bowler or a deaf or hard-of-hearing non-bowler who has a knowledge in the public relations field.

SECTION III. The Executive Committee may attend and vote as members of the Board of Directors at any meeting of that body, but any individual, whether he is a member of the executive committee. The Board of Directors, or members of both, may be allowed but one vote on any question at such meetings.

SECTION IV. All officers shall be elected by ballot at the meeting of the Board of Directors and they shall hold office for two (2) years. Incoming officers shall take office effective the first Monday of October following the election.

ARTICLE V - DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS

SECTION I. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors and Executive Committee and shall appoint an auditing committee consisting of three members: two from the tournament city and one from outside the city.

The President shall appoint all other committees as may be deemed necessary. He shall be the chief executive officer of the Association and as such enforce all the provisions and purposes hereof. Any vacancies that occur between meetings shall be filled (pro-tem) by the President until an election for the remainder of the term is held at the next meeting of the Board of Directors.

It shall be the duty of the president within sixty (60) days of assuming office to inform the Host City Chairman of the coming tournament of all expenses and related arrangements that are expected from the Host City by the Association.

SECTION II. The Vice President shall in absence of the President perform the duties of that office and shall be the Chairman of the Law Committee and Hall of Fame Committee.

SECTION III. The Secretary-Treasurer shall keep a true record of all proceedings of all meetings of the Association and of the Executive Committee in books provided for that purpose and shall keep a true record of all scores made in all tournaments held by this Association.

He shall have charge of and conduct all correspondence.

He shall open an account in a reliable bank of his residence city to be known as the DIXIE DEAF BOWLING ASSOCIATION account and shall deposit in this account all monies received from entries and revenues and distribute same on checks signed by himself. In the payment of bills and/or prizes, no check of this Association may be made out to "CASH" for any reason. At the end of tournament he shall turn over to the Executive Committee a statement showing the outcome of the tournament. This is to be done within sixty (60) days after the close of the tournament. He shall keep a true and correct account of all receipts and disbursement and make an annual report to the Board of Directors.

The Secretary-Treasurer shall be bonded for full amount of tournament fees and bank deposits at the expense of the Association Bond to be held by Active President for safekeeping.

The Secretary-Treasurer shall receive as compensation during his term in office the sum of 50 cents per man per event. This shall come from tournament expense fees.

The Secretary-Treasurer shall adhere to the following schedule.

1. mail checks for prize money within thirty (30) days after the close of the tournament.
2. Send certified letters to holders of uncashed after ninety (90) days of mailing date.
3. Ninety (90) days after certified letter has been send, revert prize money back to General Fund.

The Secretary-Treasurer is provided with the authority to set the tournament expense fee as he sees fit to meet the tournament expenses.

The Secretary-Treasurer is required to give receipts to all persons from whom money is collected. Statement of expenditures (bank) and deposits required to be submitted to Auditors.

Upon receipt of entry blanks and fees, the Secretary-Treasurer shall mail four copies of the bowling schedule of the coming tournament and the latest By-Laws to the team captains.

SECTION IV. All captains shall receive four (4) copies each of minutes of the meeting, report of receipts and expenditures, proposal blanks by the second week of October.

SECTION V. During odd-numbered years, the Secretary-Treasurer shall mail out Hall of Fame nomination form with the entry forms to all captains and Executive Board members.

SECTION VI. The Recording Secretary shall assist the Secretary-Treasurer at the annual meeting of the Board of Directors. The Recording Secretary shall make a carbon copy of the meeting in progress and leave the copy with the Secretary-Treasurer. He shall re-write minutes and mail a clean copy to the Secretary-Treasurer within thirty (30) days.

SECTION VII. The Publicity Director is responsible to publish the DDBA quarterly newsletter and mail out to the active bowlers and subscribers, and to write and send out the news releases to other deaf publications.

SECTION VII. The DDBA will pay each officers \$15.00 diem per day.

ARTICLE VI - HALL OF FAME COMMITTEE

SECTION I. The Hall of Fame Committee shall consist of the Vice President as the chairman and the Secretary-Treasurer.

SECTION II. The Vice President and Secretary-Treasurer shall be the only members who shall collate all information in regards to the selection of the Hall of Fame Bowler or Leader nominations before presentation to the Executive Board to be voted on.

SECTION III. The Hall of Fame Committee shall report all findings to the Executive Committee who shall constitute the nominating and voting body.

ARTICLE VII - AMENDMENTS

SECTION I. The Constitution, By-Laws and rules may be amended or repealed by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members of the Board of Directors present, a quorum voting, at the annual meeting.

SECTION II. Any proposal of changes of laws or amendments must be made in writing to the Vice President thirty (30) days before tournament date.

ARTICLE VIII - TOURNAMENT RULES

SECTION I. The tournament shall be sanctioned and conducted according to the rules and regulations of the American Bowling Congress (ABC) unless otherwise arranged with the Congress by the Secretary-Treasurer.

SECTION II. All prizes will be awarded on a handicap, based on 70% of the difference of bowler's average and scratch being 200.

No individual's handicap shall exceed 42 pins per game in any event. Use highest ABC sanctioned average, 21 games or more from the previous season. If no average from previous season, use highest average of 21 games or more of the current season as of March 1st. If March 1st, current season average is 10 or more pins above previous season average, current average must be used. Eligible bowlers who have no acceptable average in accordance with the above rule may enter the tournament at 200 average.

Bowlers who report a lower average than required by the Association tournament rules and bowlers who do not report prize winnings of \$300.00 or more in any event in a tournament within the previous twelve month period and his actual score position and amount won to tournament official at time of entry for possible re-rating shall forfeit tournament entry fee and prize winnings.

SECTION III. Any and all complaints, protest and contentions as to scores bowled shall be made within 24 hours after the

game in question has been bowled, in writing to the Secretary-Treasurer, to be taken up with the executive committee. No changes or corrections of any kind shall be solicited or attempted otherwise.

SECTION IV. The President shall choose two (2) non-bowlers who are members of DDBA to serve with the three officers to check/verify scores of teams and all events.

SECTION V. No Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) members are allowed to participate in any event of a tournament. Former PBA members may be reinstated in the Dixie Deaf Bowling Association after two (2) years have lapsed since leaving the PBA. The separation from the PBA must be verified by a letter from a PBA officer.

SECTION VI. The head scorer during the tournament shall be a hearing man to avoid unnecessary interference by bowlers. He shall be paid a fee of \$20.00 - half of which is to be paid by the Association and half by the Host City. Scorers shall be paid up to 25 cents per line out of the tournament expense fee.

SECTION VII. The annual association tournament of four men shall bowl 3 games on Saturday and singles shall bowl 5 games on Sunday.

SECTION VIII. Scratch Masters qualifying round shall be on Saturday morning with 4 games across 8 lanes with roll-off game on Sunday afternoon, providing the Host City has a bowling establishment of 32 or more lanes: Effective 1994, team event and singles event will be bowled on all day Saturday, and the Masters tournament on all day Sunday.

SECTION X. Each bowler must wear a collar shirt. No blue jeans will be allowed to wear during the tournament.

ARTICLE IX - TOURNAMENT CITY

SECTION I. The city in which the annual tournament is to be held be selected four (4) years in advance by ballot at the annual meeting of Association.

SECTION II. The tournament shall be held only in the Dixie States as named in Article I, Section I.

SECTION III. Only organizations of the deaf shall sponsor or host the Association's tournament.

SECTION IV. Bidders for the tournament must submit letter of intent from clubs or association of the deaf, from hotel (headquarters), and from bowling establishment(s) at the time of bid.

SECTION V. The annual tournament shall be held during the month of May, preferably the Memorial Day weekend.

SECTION VI. Any team or sponsor submitting bid for the tournament must be a member of the Association for two (2) years prior to submitting the bid.

SECTION VII. The organization winning the bid shall deposit with the Secretary-Treasurer 25% (1/4) of the total prize money and at the same time present letters of verification from hotel and bowling establishment. Thereafter the organization shall pay 25% (1/4) of the prize money every year until paid in full. (effective 1991.)

SECTION VIII. The successful bidder must send a team or representative to every tournament hereafter to make a report on the program of their tournament plans.

SECTION IX. The Secretary-Treasurer shall be notified within 6 months before the date of tournament if the host unable to hold the tournament. Thereupon prize money shall be returned to the host with 50% of 1/4 prize money deposit forfeited to the Dixie Deaf Bowling Association.

ARTICLE X - DUTIES OF HOST

SECTION I. The General Chairman of the Tournament Committee shall submit monthly reports of its progress to the Secretary-Treasurer of this Association, beginning the first of December preceding its tournament.

SECTION II. The Host City is responsible to adapt the dates announced at the Board of Directors' meeting which will be known to all the delegates.

SECTION III. The Host City shall send out advertising matter of the forthcoming tournament sixty (60) days prior to the date of the tournament sixty (60) days prior to the date of the tournament. Guaranteed cash prizes for first place of event must be stated and placed in circulation.

SECTION IV. If the host club or organization fails to meet requirements of Section III by date, the host club/organization must pay a fine of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) to the Secretary-Treasurer with added penalty of \$25.00 of fine per week until date that advertising materials (flyers, circulars, etc.) is received through the mail by Secretary-Treasurer.

SECTION V. The organization sponsoring the tournament shall print the schedule and prize list of the tournament. Sufficient copies of these shall be supplied to the Secretary-Treasurer of the Association.

SECTION VI. The President, Vice President and Secretary-Treasurer shall be reimbursed for transportation to the tournament city at 15 cents a mile or full fare for tourist class airline seat. Three-fourth (3/4) of the expense is to borne by the Association and one-fourth by the tournament city.

SECTION VII. The host will pay for the President's room for two (2) nights. The Association and the Host will pay for Vice President's room for two (2) nights on a 50-50 basis. Dixie Deaf Bowling Association will pay the Secretary-Treasurer and the Publicity Director for their rooms for two (2) nights.

SECTION VIII. The host will pay officers' expenses on trip between tournaments if requested.

SECTION IX. The Secretary-Treasurer shall make at least one trip to the host city during the spring of the pending tournament to inspect the bowling establishment and complete any necessary business.

SECTION X. The host shall bear the expense of sleeve insignias adapted by the Association to be presented to the four members of the winning team.

SECTION XI. In event that the host club/organization fails to meet obligations outlined in Article IX and in the guidelines provided by the Secretary-Treasurer, any expenses for travel and communications made by the Secretary-Treasurer to the host club/organization or general chairman shall be billed to the host club/organization or the general chairman.

SECTION XII. Proceeds from the sale of program booklets shall become the property of the host.

SECTION XIII. The bowlers must pay their combo tickets at time they send entry fees.

SECTION XIV. The price of general admission to the alley shall be set by the host.

SECTION XV. Host must report the auditor to DDBA officers within 30 days or fine 10% interest from gross income from registration, etc.

ARTICLE XI - NATIONAL CRISIS

SECTION I. In event of national crisis, such as weekend closing of gas stations or gas rationing, war, etc., the host has the right to cancel the Association's tournament by February 1st.

SECTION II. The Host has the right to select another year for hosting the tournament or to have all deposits of prize money returned.

ARTICLE XII - HALL OF FAME NOMINATIONS

SECTION I. The Association shall have a Hall of Fame to honor and remember those bowlers and leaders whose activity has been outstanding and worthy of merit and recognition.

SECTION II. Once every two years during even numbered years the Hall of Fame Committee shall hold an election to elect one bowler and one leader to the Hall of Fame at an executive meeting before the Board of Directors meeting.

SECTION III. Nominations shall be in writing together with historical data and bowling records to the Council or Board at the annual meeting to be considered by the Hall of Fame Committee at the next Hall of Fame election.

SECTION IV. Nominations must be submitted to the Vice President at least three months prior to the election in order that he may notify other members of the committee and provide them with any data available to him.

Bowler Nominee Requirements

SECTION 5. Nominee must meet the following requirements as a Bowler:

- (a) Nominee must have participated in at least eight (8) tournaments of the Association to be eligible for nomination.
- (b) Nominee must have shown outstanding achievement in the Association tournaments; however, nominee's records in other sanctioned bowling tournaments and competitions hosted or sponsored by an association or bona-fide organization or bona-fide organization of the Deaf shall be considered and may be used as a basis for his nomination.
- (c) League averages, or winners of individual classics where less than sixty (60) bowlers participated and any participation in competition not sanctioned by American Bowling Congress shall not be recognized.
- (d) Request waiver of above rules by writing to the committee which may or may not make special exceptions.
- (e) Current officers of the Association are not eligible for nomination until two years have passed since they last held office. (Death or disability voids this eligibility and can be nominated.)

Leader Nominee Requirements

SECTION VI. Nominee must meet the following requirements as a leader:

- (a) A nominee who has demonstrated exceptional leadership and provided valuable service towards the Association for eight (8) years shall be eligible for nomination.
- (b) Request waiver of above rules by writing to the Council which may or may not make special exceptions.
- (d) Current officers of the Association are not eligible for nomination until two years have passed since they last held office. (Death or disability voids the eligibility and can be nominated.)

Voting Procedures

SECTION VII. Nominee in either category receiving most ballots that can be cast at election shall be declared elected.

SECTION VIII. Electors shall be entitled to three ballots for election on bowler and leader nominees.

SECTION IX. Secretary-Treasurer shall mail the ballot of three category of three ballots each with the picture of the nominees and return to the Hall of Fame committee for the final election.

SECTION X. An honorary member, elected by a three-fourths vote at the Board of Directors, shall automatically be admitted to the Hall of Fame.

SECTION XI. The plaques shall be awarded to the elected Hall of Famer.
